



## INTRODUCTORY DAY

### PROSPECTUS

The Introductory Day is held twice a year; in the Spring and Autumn.

Students attend:        9.30 a.m. - 5.30 p.m. (Human)  
                                  9.30 a.m. - 5.30 p.m. (Agriculture)

The cost is £75 per student.

The College reserves the right to cancel the courses.

The Introductory Day is designed to provide a brief general introduction to Radionics. It comprises lectures on the nature and history of Radionics, the rudiments of radionic practice, an explanation of how a radionic analysis is made and an outline of the professional training.

The Day is intended for two categories of person, namely: those who seriously intend to take a full course of training with a view to qualifying as professional Radionic Practitioners and those who, while not wishing to train, are nevertheless genuinely interested in the subject and wish to acquaint themselves with some of its essential principles. In the case of the former, attendance at an Introductory Day is an obligatory step and arrangements will be made for an interview.
